






What makes up the system today?


- Primary Care

- Financial Stewardship
- Responsible for oversight of the performance of organization
 - Quality of care delivered
 - Legislative compliance
 - Quality of work environment
- Appointment of CEO and Chief of Staff/Chair of MAC
- Appointment of physicians, dentists and midwives
- Strategic Plan including Mission, Vision, Values
- Meeting Accountability Agreements




Health System Funding Reform

- Price per procedure in select areas with intention to integrate quality






Health System Funding Reform (HSFR) - Goal

Physicians and other community regulated providers

- Physicians
- Physiotherapy
- Other allied health providers
- Chiropractors
- Massage therapists
- Other complementary health providers





How is the system funded?

Home care and community services

- Long Term Care are prescribed line by line budgets
- Home care is based on a variation of HBAM
- Community agencies are provided a global budget but are not allowed to carry over any surplus and there is no support for deficits
- Family physicians are either Fee for Service or capitation models with or without funding for an interprofessional team

- Safe, effective, patient centred, efficient, timely, equitable






What is Quality?


Health Quality Ontario defines health quality as "achieving better health outcomes and experiences for every person living in Ontario"



Translating External to Internal



Excellent Care for All Act (2010)

- Mandated establishment of Quality Committees of Boards, composition and key accountabilities
- Review of critical incident data
- Respond to MAC recommendations on systemic or recurring quality of care issues
- Make recommendations to the Board regarding quality improvements or policies
- Ensure best practice information on quality and safety is shared across the organization
- Oversee preparation of the Quality Improvement Plan
- Strong focus on patient experience




Quality Improvement Plan (QIP)

Health Quality Ontario

- "A QIP is a public, documented set of quality commitments that a health care organization makes to its patients, clients, residents, staff and community on an annual basis to improve quality through focused targets and actions."
- The QIP should both complement system and provincial priorities and address local opportunities for priority improvements.
- The QIP should be a blueprint to support improvement.

- How do we improve patient outcomes and experience?
- How do we improve the health of the population?
- How do we ensure the system is sustainable?
- How do we create a great work environment?
