OA Advocates for Our Members

We have noticed that there has been a lot of messaging and media coverage recently advocating for increased family physician compensation. While we appreciate and support the OMA pivoting to advocacy on direct compensation matters, we believe the **OMA's compensation advocacy efforts in the media and at the negotiating table must include anesthesiologists and other specialists whose needs have taken a back seat for far too long at the OMA**. To voice our opinion, we have sent a <u>letter to the</u> <u>OMA's CEO and Board Chair</u> to ask that Ontario's Anesthesiologists be included in the OMA's compensation advocacy efforts in the media and at the negotiating table.
