Tariff Update

PSA Implementation – Year 3

The section submitted proposals to the Physician Payment Committee for Year 3 of the current PSA last fall. These would be potentially implemented April 1, 2025, pending appropriate funding where necessary. The section executive will be meeting with the PPC to discuss the submission in February.

Health-Care Advocacy and Government Relations

We continue to meet with government representatives regarding our environmental and anesthesia HHR position statements. We have recently met with representatives from the Ministry of Health; the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks; and several MPPs.
