Governance

Tariff Report

1. PSA Implementation – Year 3

- The section has recently submitted proposals to the Physician Payment Committee for year 3 of the current PSA. These will be implemented April 1, 2025.

- Retroactive payments are planned for August and December 2024 (for 2023-24) and August 2025. (for 2024-25).

- The year 3 increase is based on a cost-sharing formula that depends on the actual physician services spend in 2023-24 and will not be known until next year.

- This is confusing as we will be implementing year 3 of the current PSA at the start of year 2 of the next PSA.

2. Year 3 Proposal Survey Highlights

- Approximately 13% participation rate with broad demographic representation.

- 80% support for pursuing deferred APS proposal to redefine limited pain consult.

- Strong signal for increases to the unit value.

- Many themes for undervalued services with the most common being: BMI, ASA, gynecology, general surgery, T&A, OB and pediatrics.

- The tentative proposals we submitted contain options to address elements of this but will be subject to funding and costing.

3. PSA Implementation – Burden-based HOCC

- Members are completing both renewal applications and new applications to the new burden-based HOCC system.

- At this time, there is no way to estimate the value that will be assigned to each of the call levels nor can we predict the process they will use to adjudicate the requests.

4. PSA Implementation – CMPA fees

- The 10-year CMPA agreement expires this year but the last PSA extends it until a new one is negotiated as part of the next PSA

- The 2024 Ontario Anesthesiology CMPA fees are \$11,340. The physician contribution is expected to be \$7,361 per year.

5. Negotiations 2024

- Negotiations between our negotiations task force and the MOH started last month.

- The chair and tariff-chair are being kept updated via monthly meetings covered by an NDA.

6. Unintended Consequences of Revisions to J069

- The PPC has responded to our submission regarding radiofrequency ablation services formerly provided using J069.

- They have confirmed that RF of spinal nerves is insured using N556/E396 and N534 as per the billing rules in the SOB pertaining to those services.

- They have also confirmed that there are no fee codes for any other newer RF services and recommend that we consider a submission for codes for new services supported by a technology review by the Ontario Health Technology Assessment Committee (OHTAC).

- Given that there are no billing codes and that the technology has not been approved by the Ministry, the only possible conclusion we can draw from this is that any other forms of RF not covered by those fee codes remain uninsured services. At this time, Ontario's Anesthesiologists has no plans to pursue this issue further with them.
